

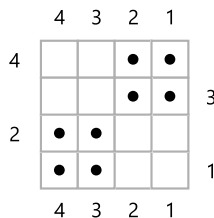

## Double Moss stitch

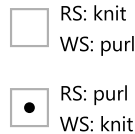

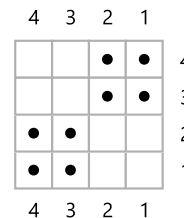

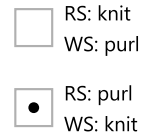

### Instructions in flat

It can be done on an even or odd number of stitches in the case of flat knitting.

**Ligne 1 (RS):** K2, p2.

**Even rows:** Knit the stitches as they appear

**Odd lines:** Knit stitches the reverse of the current stitch.

Knit the stitches in the reverse order of the stitch shown:

- if there is a loop then knit
- if there is a V, purl

### Instructions in the circular

It is advisable to do it on an even number of stitches multiple of 4 because this avoids an aesthetic problem on the starting point of the row. Because in the case of an odd number and not a multiple of 4 there will be successive identical stitch.

**Row 1 (RS):** K2, p2

**Even rows:** Knit the stitches as they appear

**Odd lines:** Knit stitches the reverse of the current stitch.

Knit the stitches in the reverse order of the stitch shown:

- if there is a loop then knit
- if there is a V, purl
